The goals of the Construction Training Fund are to improve the quality of training and to increase the number of skilled workers in the building and construction industry. The funds received from the collection of the training levy go back to the industry to support training and skills development.

Scope Training cannot guarantee funding eligibility, however we will assist in facilitating this process where possible.

Training must be conducted in Western Australia.

Courses can be undertaken through face to face workshops and online.

The Supplementary Skills and OS&H program provides a subsidy of \$30 per hour (to a maximum of \$240 per eight hour day, or 70% of the actual course cost, whichever is lower) for a wide range of courses undertaken by eligible employees at metropolitan RTPs. The maximum amount that can be claimed per employee, per course, is \$1,300.

How do students claim the rebate?

The following documentation is required to be submitted to the fund directly by the student/organisation

Individuals

- Individual claim form (available from the Training Fund’s website at bcitf.org).
- Proof of payment (receipt from Scope Training).
- Proof of successful course completion (statement of attainment and/or certificate).

Employers

- Employer’s claim form (from bcitf.org).
- Copy of the training provider’s paid invoice/receipt for payment of course.
- Proof of successful course completion (statement of attainment and/or certificate).
- Invoice from employer to Training Fund for subsidy (plus GST).
- Completed survey forms.

Claims must be received by the Training Fund within 12 months of successful completion of the course.
