

# Certificate IV in Work Health and Safety BSB41412

## Course Overview

The Certificate IV in WHS is designed to provide students with the fundamentals of occupational health and safety across all a broad range of industries in Australia. It is relevant to supervisors, Health and safety representatives, safety officers and those are involved in the management of occupational risk. The Certificate IV is considered the minimum qualification required for anyone wishing to work within the field of occupational health and safety.

## Entry Requirements

There are no formal requirements to gain entry into this qualification; however the Scope Training workshops are aimed at participants who have workplace experience of health and safety systems and operations (e.g hazard report forms)



## Time Investment

The amount of effort and time required for this qualification is based upon your existing skills and experience (find out more on how competency based learning works). It is suggested that the course take approximately 300 hours of learning. However we find that due to our learner profile and the methods by which our programs are structured this is rarely the case
