

Diploma of Work Health and Safety BSB51315

Course Benefits

Participants will learn how to identify, assess and control conditions in the work environment that are harmful to the health and safety of people in all occupations. You will study the functions of policy development, risk management, compensation, rehabilitation, injury management and application of the legislation. Upon completion students will possess the relevant skills and knowledge to contribute to the development and implementation of WHS systems, policy, compliance and culture.

Entry Requirements

Ideally participants should hold a Certificate IV in Health and Safety otherwise experience within a health and safety environment. Students are required to have access to a workplace, ideally to apply the principles of risk management and participate in the development, consultation and implementation of WHSMS; this may include a previous workplace.



Time Investment

The amount of effort and time required for this qualification is based upon your existing skills and experience (find out more on how competency based learning works). It is suggested that the course take approximately 500 hours of learning. However we find that due to our learner profile and the methods by which our programs are structured this is rarely the case

Course Overview

This course has been specifically designed in consultation with industry to provide a systematic practical approach to managing work health and safety. Students are required to have completed the Certificate IV in Work Health and Safety or demonstrate sufficient industry knowledge and skills related to health and safety.

This course is designed for students currently working within the area of work health and safety who wish to gain more specialised skills and knowledge. You will study the theory, legislative requirements and practical applications of work health and safety principles to enable you to build upon existing knowledge; provide guidance in the compliance of legislation and implementation of effective WHS management systems.
